Safety Overview:

AT SHELL, YOUR SAFETY IS OUR TOP PRIORITY. BE ALERT. PLEASE BE AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS AT ALL TIMES. FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL NEEDS, YOU SHOULD **DIAL 911.**

Key Points/Reminders:

Remember to give your hotel information to your family before leaving home in the event of an emergency. It is also a good idea to leave the contact information for our event staff with your family should they need to reach us while you are traveling.

Do not forget to bring any medications that you require. Also please alert the event staff of any allergies (or other health conditions) that you may have and any medication that would need to be administered in the event of an allergic reaction.

Please review hotel evacuation procedures, which are posted in your room. Become familiar with the staircase, should you need to evacuate the hotel.

Should you leave the hotel alone, it is suggested you leave a note or tell someone where you have gone, should an emergency occur, and you cannot be located. Always remember to travel as a group whenever possible. Carry a cell phone and keep contact numbers readily available.

Keep a low profile. Do not wear flashy jewelry or carry expensive purses. Do not show large amounts of cash.

Please use hotel safes to secure personal/valuable property.

Use caution against hacking when using public/hotel internet. Disconnect computer or device from internet when not in use.

Familiarize yourself with the location of an AED in your hotel/at the racetrack. Only AED trained individuals should use in an emergency.

Please wear a seatbelt during all motor vehicle transfers and it is Shell policy to only use vehicles (including taxis) that have seat belts.

Drivers are not allowed to use cell phone during transit.

Use handrails when taking stairs. Do not climb on or lean over railings.

Avoid texting/talking on cell phone while walking. Stay alert and be aware of your surroundings at all times.

Stay hydrated. Drink plenty of water. Monitor alcohol consumption and keep the heat in mind.

Apply sunscreen frequently to avoid getting sunburned. Use insect repellent to avoid bites.

Be Proactive. Do not be afraid to intervene if you see someone doing something that could injure themselves or others. If you see something, say something.

If you see trouble, move to a secure location, or take a different route. Remember the RUN-HIDE-FIGHT principles.

COVID-19 Specific Reminders:

Attendees must follow state, local and/or venue guidelines or mandates regarding masks. Mask policy subject to change. Shell highly recommends following the CDC guidance regarding mask usage and recommends MEDICAL GRADE MASKS (instead of cloth masks) that are well-fitting and form a leak free seal around your nose and mouth.

All Attendees must agree and sign the Shell COVID-19 Release Form. Attendees must agree to the Daily COVID-19 Screening Questions prior to departing hotel for racetrack provided by the Shell COVID Ambassador.

All Attendees must follow COVID precautions regardless of vaccination status.

Attendees should carry their own pen to use if a signature is required for check-in or check-out.

Upon entering hotel room, use sanitizing wipes on high touch surfaces such as door handles, light switches, remote control, sink & shower faucets, desktop, coffee maker, etc.

Attendees should determine whether to have hotel housekeeping service during stay. Try to minimize time housekeeping staff is in room during hotel stay.

Attendees should refrain from using hotel gym, pool or hot tub unless you are able to ensure the space has been adequately sanitized, you can maintain social distancing, and the facility is monitoring capacity limits.

After entering or exiting a room, wash your hands with soap and hot water per guidance for hand washing. If hand washing is not possible, use alcohol-based hand sanitizer as soon as possible.

All Attendees must notify Shell contact immediately if they develop any COVID-like symptoms.

All Attendees must follow their local/state requirements regarding quarantine after travel to Canada (if applicable).



When was the track built?

The man-made Notre Dame Island in the middle of the St Lawrence River was created for the 1967 Expo 67 World's Fair. Once the expo and the ensuing 1976 Montreal Summer Olympics had left town, some clever people decided to make a race track out of the island's roads. And lo, the Circuit Ile Notre-Dame, as it then was, came to be.

When was its first Grand Prix?

With the Canadian Grand Prix having been in search of a permanent home for a number of years in the 1960s and 1970s, the Circuit Ile Notre-Dame first hosted the race in 1978. Fittingly, Gilles Villeneuve claimed his maiden win, at the track that would end up bearing his name.




The first Canadian grand prix 1960

What's the circuit like?

The fast, low-downforce circuit is one of the drivers' favourites. The track is quite stop-start, with lots of heavy-braking chicanes and the famous hairpin to get the anchors working hard. Out of the corners, though, the track is quick and flowing, while the most iconic piece of the circuit comes right at the end of the lap: the Wall of Champions, so-called after excursions into it from Damon Hill, Jacques Villeneuve and Michael Schumacher during the 1999 Canadian Grand Prix weekend.

Fresh off Monaco and Baku, two very different street circuits.


The Montrealais really embrace their Grand Prix weekend, with the charming city turning into an F1-loving party town in the week leading up to the race. For the Grand Prix itself, the leafy setting makes the Circuit Gilles-Villeneuve one of Formula 1's most laidback venues.

Shell's History with F1

Shell's partnership with Scuderia Ferrari has been around since the first ever FIA Formula 1® World Championship series in 1950, making it one of the longest running and most successful collaborations in motorsport history. The race fuels and lubricants have powered Scuderia Ferrari to ten FIA Formula One Constructors' titles and 12 Drivers' Championship wins. Since Ferrari build power units for Alfa Romeo and Haas, Shell also supports and supplies for them.




